What are the classroom expectations?

Students are expected to follow the following classroom rules at all times.

- 1) You are expected to be on time.
- 2) Be prepared at all times.
- 3) Follow CSMS rules (this includes no electronics or phones in the room)

- 5) Follow directions and stay on task.

What do I do if I am absent from class?

Attendance at each class is very important, because a lot of subject material can be covered. If you are absent, it is your responsibility to make up the work by (1) checking Canvas (2) getting any notes and

assignments from the WDIM folder, (3) see me at the end of the next class period to schedule time to

make up work, and (4) show me any assignments you did not turn in because of your absence.

You are always required to make up missed work and turn in assignments collected during your absences.

How is my grade determined?

Grades are calculated using a point system from each of the following areas:

Tests and Quizzes - test and guizzes range in point values from 20 - 100 points. They will be announced at

least 3 days in advance.

Classwork and Homework- Classwork/ Homework may include written work as well as reading and taking notes

or may be an online assignment (including Khan Academy), all of which will be given almost daily to reinforce the day's lesson. Points range for each assignment. The percentage for homework will not exceed 10% of the

marking period grade. The percentage for classwork will not exceed 10% of the marking period grade.

Extra-Credit- opportunities for extra credit do happen for a variety of reasons, but there is a catch. No one

may earn more than 2 points a day.

How can I get extra help?

As soon as you experience frustration, you should seek extra help. This is available from me before school on

Tuesday mornings and during W.I.N.

How can my parents and guardians help?

As parents and guardians, please encourage your child to read and use their textbook. Also, please check to

see that they have all their supplies. Monitor their absences. Check their notebooks and homework.
