






Welcome to 9th Grade English. We are looking forward to the start of the 2018-2019 school year at Neshaminy High School. We are excited about the opportunity to get to know you, and we are looking forward to a happy and productive school year.



Ninth grade English class is a wonderful opportunity for students to grow as responsible and knowledgeable individuals. It is imperative that students remain focused, motivated and determined throughout the course of the year in order to experience success. We will be studying many types of literature this year, including short-stories, novels, and poetry. This year, we are incorporating a Genre Study in Realistic Contemporary Fiction; as students learn the tricks to reading this genre, it will increase their abilities as readers in general.

Some titles that we will be reading include, but are not limited to, Romiette and Julio, by Sharon Draper, "Philomel Cottage" by Agatha Christie, Romeo and Juliet by William Shakespeare and To Kill a Mockingbird by Harper Lee. We will also be working extensively on developing fundamental writing and vocabulary skills.




- I" Three Ring English binder OR a divider for English within a larger binder - Loose-leaf paper (in binder)

learn in class. Completing at home assignments is vital for students to stay on task during classroom activities. Studies show that family involvement in a child's education is one of the strongest indicators of student achievement. We ask that families work together to complete homework assignments so that students

develop a strong sense of responsibility and preparedness. Homework assignments will include reading (especially of independent reading books throughout the genre study units), short writing assignments, discussion preparation, and major writing assignments, such as essays, research papers, and literary analysis writings. Completing these assignments will allow students to gain a higher level of thinking, as well as

meet Pennsylvania standards for reading and writing. All assignments will be due at the beginning of class on the due date. We will use homework assignments for classroom activities and discussions. Therefore, smaller assignments will not be accepted after the due Late, with few exceptions. Major assignments must also be handed in when class begins on the due date, unless it is a writing assignment through turnitin.com that is due at midnight.
